

Donna's Son Travis and wife Crystal welcomed their second daughter Mattie Rae on June 3rd. Meadow (now five years old) just loves her little sister.









Joe and I made our first trip to the North Carolina Mountains and enjoyed a weekend in Linville, NC. We went to Grandfather Mountain, Linville Caverns

and spent some time at Linville Winery.
On GRANDFATHER MOUNTAIN'S LINVILLE PEAK
they built a MILE HIGH SWINGING BRIDGE TO give
visitors access to the breathtaking view. The 228
foot suspension bridge spans an 80 foot chasm at
more than one mile in elevation. The bridge was
built in 1952 in Greensboro, NC and then reassembled on top of the mountain which took three



weeks. The bridge was rebuilt in 1999 using the original towers. The cables, floor boards, and side rails were all replaced using galvanized steel.





The Linville Caverns are located deep within Humpback Mountain. Linville Caverns opened for public tours in 1937 and is open year round. Since that time many upgrades have been made to the pathways and lighting.



I also enjoyed a day at Biltmore Estes in Ashville, NC with my daughter in law Crystal and two of my granddaughter's Alexis and Alyssa. It was Christmas at Biltmore.



Fun facts about Biltmore Estates:

- Built in Ashville, NC George Vanderbilt started construction in 1889
- George Vanderbilt officially opened to friends and family on Christmas Eve 1895
- Built on 125,000 acres. It still remains the largest private home in America. Which consists of 250 rooms, (to name a few) 35 bedrooms, 65 fireplaces, 43 bathrooms, 3 kitchens, electric elevators, a bowling alley, swimming pool, and gym.
- The name comes from "bilt" which is a region that the Vanderbilt family own in Holland and "more" which refers to countryside that is quite hilly, in old English terms.
- The Biltmore Estate houses the most visited winery in the United States
- In 1930 the Biltmore Estate was opened to the public.
- ♦ There are more than 6,000 weddings on the Biltmore Estate each year.
- At Christmas time approximately 15,000 strings of lights are used, as well as 100 evergreen trees and 41 indoor trees to decorate.
